Decentralizing the Philippines will essentially create smaller, more manageable and semi-autonomous economic zones. If it were a U.S. style breakdown then each "State" government would be able to create its own tax rates (checked by the federal constitution), manage its own services/infrastructure more closely and more-or-less create a competitive market for local legislatures to make decisions.
